	AA (Alcoholics Anonymous)	Alcoholics Anonymous is a fellowship of people who share their experience, strength and hope with each other so that they may solve their common problem and help others recover from alcoholism. Support those who wish to stop drinking alcohol through weekly support groups
	BASS (Stonham)	Offers supported housing to those eligible for HDC and Bail
	Hibiscus	Support to foreign nationals , British BME (Black, Minority Ethnic, Refugee women and women seeking asylum) and women of undetermined nationality status. Advocacy, welfare & IAG. Working with women and men within the British Criminal Justice system.
	Hibiscus - Human Trafficking	Hibiscus and Trauma Team - Identify women and men who have been trafficked into and out of the UK
	Job Centre Plus	Offer advice and support for employment and training . Advice on all benefit claims. Set up JSA claims from prison [Advance Claims to Job Seeker's Allowance to engage with Work Programme on release]. Arrange Fresh start appointments for JSA to help with finding employment and training on release.
	MIND	Mind offers mental health support to male and female residents focusing on the highest OGR score categories to address the root causes of reoffending through 1:2:1 and group work The key areas will be cognitive behavioural interventions, life skills, problem solving, emotional management negotiation skills.
	Shaw Trust (CF03 Project)	This new project is aimed at providing skills and employability support to suitable women in HMP Peterborough, who are disadvantaged and disabled. The top priorities for the project are as follows: 1)Social Inclusion 2) Extensive support for the hardest to help (not engaged) 3)Enhanced support to address multiple and complex barriers 4) Improved access to services (including mainstream) 5) Benefit from intensive engagement and sustainment 6) Appropriate/timely interventions to increase employability. The service is aimed at: Females only, those involved in gang activity, Those with significant substance misuse, Domestic violence/Sex workers, limited family ties and support networks
	YMCA Respect Project	This is a new 6 week programme aimed at victims and perpetrators of domestic abuse. It is designed as an intervention to empower victims of domestic abuse, to make positive choices about their lives by providing information and support within a group context. It gives women and men an opportunity and space to develop ways of thinking and behaving to protect themselves from harm. It is also aimed at perpetrators to offer support to reduce re-offending. The programme is targeted at residents that are 25 years of age and under
	Unlock Banking (Bank Accounts)	Help set up bank accounts for residents who have 12 weeks or more left of their sentence
BeNCH (Bedfordshire, Northamptonshire, Cambridgeshire, Hertfordshire)	St Giles/BeNCH CRC	Deliver Core Resettlement services on behalf of BeNCH CRC
	C2C (Crime to Christ) * Available on release	C2C work with female residents from Bench and other areas (Excluding Derbyshire Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, Rutland, Norfolk and Suffolk). Their aim is to reduce re-offending by offering support across all 9 pathways to reduce re-offending
	Inclusion	Support for those affected by drug use releasing to the Cambridgeshire area
	Dawn Project * Available on release	Dawn project supports women being released to Cambridgeshire around all 9 pathways to reduce re-offending. Includes Access to Health advice, arranging and accompanying service users to their appointments, family support, referral to other relevant support agencies, mediation & advocacy, access to drug treatment, access to Housing advice, benefit and budgeting advice, access to CV writing and job search assistance, peer support and volunteering opportunities.
	Ormiston	Offers support to men and women resettling in the BeNCH, Norfolk & Suffolk and Essex area who will be released on license (have a responsible officer). Ormiston can also work with male and females on remand but only if they have an existing licence from a previous offence.
	Stepping Stones (Luton)	Offers support to women returning to the Bedfordshire/Northamptonshire/Luton/Cambridgeshire/Hertfordshire area around all 9 pathways to reduce re-offending.

	4Women Resource Centre (Stonham Homegroup) * Available on release	4women is based in the heart of Norwich offering arrange of holistic services. They offer 1:2:1 support, counselling, job club, domestic abuse support and any other support women from Norfolk may require to help reduce re-offending
	Doorway women's Service (Previously known as Magdalene Project)	The Magdalene project aims to engage with women to build trust. Empowering women to address their individual needs, such as isolation, mental health, offending, substance misuse and homelessness. Providing advocacy and support to access services that can meet their identified needs. Offering personalised and specialist support to sex working women, victims of sexual exploitation, trafficking and coercion and to find routes out for women wanting to exit.Offers support to those women returning to Norfolk .
	Matrix Project	The Matrix project aims to support women involved in prostitution or the effects of addiction on their lives and have some desire for change. Offers support to those women returning to Norfolk and Suffolk
	Ormiston	Offers support to men and women resettling in the BeNCH, Norfolk & Suffolk and Essex area who will be released on license (have a responsible officer). Ormiston can also work with male and females on remand but only if they have an existing licence from a previous offence.

	Just Women Project *Available on release	Just Women project aims to improve the lives of vulnerable women from Leicestershire , particularly women in the criminal justice system and those at risk of offending. They are there to help you turn your life around by offering the right support to make positive changes in changes in their life. Specialist support for women in the criminal justice system such as: emotional and practical support to help you access services in your community, benefits, housing and money advice, life skills development, help to deal with violent and abusive relationships, parenting support and family learning, education and training, opportunities to express themselves creatively, help to access employment, one to one Counselling and Just women drop in sessions in the community
